

16-19 Tuition Fund Statement

The Henley College is glad to announce receipt of additional funding to support students who are re-sitting GCSE English and GCSE mathematics qualifications as part of their programmes of study at the College. The fund has been made available by the Department for Education (DfE), in light of the support needed for students during the coronavirus pandemic. The DfE recognises the importance of English and mathematics as key study skills students need, in order to progress in education and employment.

The Henley College is using the fund to support students enrolled on GCSE English, GCSE mathematics and Functional Skills mathematics qualifications. Students normally take part in weekly GCSE or Functional Skills lessons, and complete additional self-study in English and mathematics online. While the College campuses are closed as a result of the coronavirus lockdown, the College is using the additional funding to support students enrolled on GCSE and Functional Skills English and mathematics qualifications on a 1:1 basis. Students studying GCSE and Functional Skills English and mathematics, who are identified as vulnerable or 'at risk' of not engaging in learning online are contacted by the College each day, so that the students can maintain a daily routine of study. All other GCSE and Functional Skills English and mathematics students receive a weekly 1:1 session from their tutor, on top of their English and/or maths class, and online self-study work.

The College is glad to receive the funding needed during the coronavirus crisis to support students who are taking GCSE and Functional Skills qualifications in English and mathematics.
